# **Synopsis**

Heartbreak at a college Halloween party! Entering together in a couples costume, Luna is not prepared as she catches her girlfriend flirting with another woman. In her blinding rage, all she can think to do is smash her girl into a table—effectively ending their relationship. Desperate to cope, Luna begins excessively drinking. Chaos erupts in this colorful, bizarre, and action-packed short where a drunk Luna finds herself picking fights and brawling with everyone at this party—including the other woman who started it all.







## **Director's Statement**

As a director/editor, I have always been inspired by films that push limits. When I set out to create my action short Love Bomb Baby, I knew I also wanted to push the limits of the short film medium. Inspired by drunk action sequences in *The World's End (2013)* as well as the neon aesthetics of *Last Night In Soho (2021)*, I pushed myself to create a visually interesting backdrop for an action film—while also tackling the topic of drinking.

Love Bomb Baby is a film of extremes—a hyper-stylized scenario of heartbreak that allows our protagonist, Luna, to go on a rampage and express her chaotic feelings. The absurd situations she finds herself in, whether it be sword fighting with a mop or breaking up with her girlfriend by smashing her against a table, are heightened by her prioritizing drinking. This is a film of chaos, intoxication, and absurdity, but at its core, this is a visualization of my feelings towards extreme drinking. Drinking in moderation is one thing, but in excess, it can be an inhibitor of bad decision-making. Creating an engaging narrative that is so heightened it can act as an escape was definitely the goal, but this also acts as a satirical cautionary tale on excessive drinking.

Love Bomb is only my first step in creating thrilling action films, and I look forward to continuing to pursue this ambitious way of telling stories through innovative and stylized ways. I love engaging audiences with these visually thrilling sequences while also striking them with a balance of purpose. Love Bomb Baby is the first step into a world of ambitious filmmaking I am most interested in pursuing, one of thrilling character-driven moments infused into stylized realities.



## Bryan Uvaldo | Director, Writer

Bryan Uvaldo is a Brazilian-American filmmaker currently based in NYC, with the intention of moving out to LA. Bryan has edited ten short films, and multiple promos for HBO Max, and is now the lead editor for a feature film. An intern at Warner Brothers Discovery during the Summer of 2022, Bryan worked as an editor for the marketing campaigns of *Pretty Little Liars: Original Sin & Edge of the Earth*. ## FAQ with Writer/Director Bryan Uvaldo

#### Why make an action short film?


There are so many wonderfully crafted dramas that are dark, thought-provoking, and heartfelt, but I wanted to create something fun, physical, and explosive. Attempting an action film at this small level is a bold idea that turns heads—and I love that. I aimed to create a lively experience both on the screen and on set, which led to these crazy sequences that made people ask: "How in the world are you going to do that?" To me, that is the most exciting part: coming up with something so wild and sharing that ambition to motivate people to help realize your vision. I've been obsessed with action movies all my life, and here I am having made my first one.

### Tell us more about the characters and their relationships?

In developing these characters, I wanted a love triangle expressed visually and with little dialogue. With their relationship already on the rocks as of late, Luna is very much infatuated with her girlfriend but Alexis is ready to get back out into the dating pool. Tensions are high as their smiles are fake, and all of that repressed conflict Luna has built up finally snaps when she sees Alexis flirting with another girl literally 10 feet away. A betrayal that intense forces Luna to rid herself of her girlfriend—acting on a drunken impulse to literally knock her out of her life. Luna is left spiraling as she can't help herself from continuing to drink and repress her feelings. But when provoked by a third party, all she can really do is stand her ground and fight back. And then continue fighting back until she's the last woman standing.

#### What aspects made pre-production for Love Bomb Baby unique?

When writing such a kinetic film, and being so visually orientated myself, I knew I would need to find a way to visualize it practically. I created a LEGO diorama of the apartment we would be shooting in so that I could block the entire film with LEGO minifigures and removable walls. From this, I was able to clearly explain to my DPs Tara and Zoé what I was looking for and we could understand how characters would be moving in and out of spaces. Since I am also an editor, I drew storyboards for every shot and was able to piece together the edit of the film. We shot based on the boards, and it ended up being extremely effective as 90% of my initial storyboards are shots in the film.
